Whether you are researching in this glorious building or utilizing their amazing digital collections, The Library of Congress (LOC) offers something for every family historian. Tina will walk you through all of the different ways you can engage with the Library of Congress both through their digital resources and their dynamic social media presence, to advance your family history.

Tina Beaird is the owner of Tamarack Genealogy and is the Genealogy/Local History Librarian at the Plainfield Public Library. She lectures nationally on military research, genealogical methodology, Scottish records, and archival preservation. She is a governing board director of the Illinois State Genealogical Society, the Northern Illinois Historical League and the Illinois State Historical Records Advisory Board. Tina volunteers her time with several local historical and genealogical societies, and occasionally finds time to research her own family tree, which she has been pursuing for over 20 years.

MCIGS has recently purchased the book *Advanced Genetic Genealogy: Techniques and Case Studies* edited by Debbie Parker Wayne. This publication is the answer to the question “I’ve done my DNA but now what?” Each chapter is written by an expert in genealogy genetics. Some of the topics include triangulation which is a process to help determine which DNA segments come from which ancestor, comparing one set of DNA data to another, and working with unknown or misattributed parentage. Obviously, this is a book for the more advanced DNA researcher but within the 382 pages, there are valuable explanations, charts and colored diagrams which help explain more complex techniques.

Advanced Genetic Genealogy will be housed at the Crystal Lake Public Library where one can either browse the book to determine its personal usefulness, or check the book out to more fully read it at home. As always, please allow sufficient time for the library to process the book before searching for it on the shelves.

Are you in the position of “I’ve done a DNA test, now what?” There are a number of sources available to help you. Books, websites, wikis, blogs, etc. Sorting out what’s what can be as confusing as the DNA. A few sources are listed below:

International Society of Genetic Genealogy (ISOGG) - <https://isogg.org/>. There is a lot to read there and some very good information. Check out their wiki.

Family Search Wiki - familysearch.org. This isn’t the best index, but if you narrow down to DNA basics, it’s a great place to start. Go to Search, then down to Research Wiki. Well worth the trip there!
Cyndi’s List – cyndislist.com. As of this past week, there were 557 sources under DNA.

Family Tree Seminars – <https://familytreewebinars.com/>. While most of the webinars on this site are available through subscription, there are several free DNA seminars.

Genetic Genealogy Tips & Techniques is a Facebook site administered by Blaine Bettinger. As with many genealogy sites, there is a lot of help here.

DNA Newbie – another Facebook site. This site is for you if you are new to DNA. Or perhaps you can share what you know with someone.
